

## Pont-Sur-Yonne

This little city is situated at 60 miles to the South of Paris, in the département Yonne and the Burgundy region on the secondary road 606 between the cities of Montereau and Sens. Pont-sur-Yonne is the main city of the district.

It is surrounded by the villages of Gisy-les-Nobles, Villemanoche and Saint-Sérotin. It is situated at 10 miles to the North-West of Sens, the biggest city in the area, at 75 yards high and the river Yonne flows through it.

The city is close to the national park of the Gâtinais Français at about 25 miles from Pont-sur-Yonne.

Its inhabitants are called the Pontois and the Pontoises.

The city owes its name to the bridge linking the right bank and the left one, a peculiarity that caused an eventful past.

### Local heritage

Named after the saint Notre-Dame, the church of the parish is a building the architecture of which dates back to the primitive Gothic.

Shaped as a Roman cross, the building is covered with a 30-yard steeple of elevation masonry topped with a slate arrow with angel pinnacles.
